Candidates should preferably have a Doctor of Optometry degree and be eligible for a California optometry license. Preference may be given to applicants with additional advanced degrees, residency/fellowship training, and/or advanced professional development.

Salary and faculty rank will be commensurate with the candidate's qualifications. Review of applications will continue until positions are filled or the search is closed.
