



A C A D E M I C R E G A L I A



The academic gowns that you see today represent a tradition that we inherited from the universities of the Middle Ages. Those institutions were founded by the church; and the students, being clerics, were obliged to wear their clerical gowns and caps at all times. Through the ages, these regalia were altered to accommodate both fashion and fancy.

In the United States, academic gowns are usually black, but the way they are worn and their cut distinguishes the wearer's academic degree. The bachelor's gown is worn closed; the master's and doctor's gown may be worn open or closed. Also, the sleeves of the gowns are shaped differently according to the level of degree: a bachelor's gown has long, pointed sleeves; a master's gown has oblong sleeves that are square in the back and have an arc cut away in the front; and a doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves. In addition, velvet panels and chevrons, either in black or the color representing the academic discipline, distinguish doctoral gowns.

The mortarboards or tams for all degree holders are black. The tassels attached to the mortarboards can be black, the color that the individual academic disciplines choose to represent their field, or in the case of faculty, gold. The hood is the most outstanding and colorful feature of the regalia. It is lined with the colors of the institution from which the wearers received their degrees. Its size and shape indicate the wearer's degree; and its collar is the color of the academic discipline.

Kelly green is the color used by Physician Assistant. Optometry wears seafoam green. Pharmacy uses olive green. The colors are used for both the tassel and the velvet trim on the hood. The purple and gold satin lining of the hood represents the traditional colors of Marshall B. Ketchum University.

Along with the degree holder being identified by gown style and hood color, the holder is further identified by his place in the procession. Those having the highest faculty seniority are always positioned at the end of the processional.

UNIVERSITY MACE

Colleges and universities often employ a "mace" to connect the institution's customs with the best traditions of higher education dating to the first universities founded during the Middle Ages. A mace symbolizes authority, learning and scholarship, history, reputation and values. It suggests commemoration, elegance, honor, pageantry, purpose, quality, solemnity, stability and continuity.

ALLISON MOLLET, MMS, PA-C



Allison Mollet, MMS, PA-C is a board-certified PA with over two decades of clinical experience. A graduate of the Yale University School of Medicine PA Program, she also holds a bachelor's degree in exercise science and physical therapy from Western Washington University. PA Mollet began her career in orthopedic surgery under the mentorship of Dr. Joseph Mayo and later transitioned to general and bariatric surgery/weight loss with Dr. David Oliak, continuing to collaborate with him to this day.

In 2013, PA Mollet became a founding faculty member at Marshall B. Ketchum University's School of Physician Assistant Studies where she served in various leadership roles, including Director of Didactic Education, Associate Director, and Program Director. She was instrumental in developing the program's curriculum and securing ongoing accreditation.

In 2018, she received a grant from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) through PAEA to create a substance use disorder curriculum tailored for PA students. This initiative involved collaboration with PA leaders nationwide, resulting in the first such curriculum designed by PAs for PA students.

PA Mollet also established Grace Miller Day, an annual interprofessional event designed to inspire elementary students to pursue careers in medicine. In addition to being a regular instructor within the School of PA Studies, she collaborated with colleagues from the optometry and pharmacy programs to co-create the first "Super Simulation" event for all MBKU students, and served as a lecturer in Lab Interpretation for optometry's Advanced Practice Workshop. She has presented nationally in the areas of interprofessionalism and student assessment and has actively advocated for the PA profession as a speaker at numerous recruitment events.

In May 2024, PA Mollet transitioned from academia to fulfill her dream of opening a clinic focused on hormonal health, weight loss, and wellness care. She completed additional advanced training in hormonal health, including thyroid disease, perimenopause and menopause. Her goal is to educate patients about the health risks associated with hormonal deficiencies and to optimize hormone levels appropriately to alleviate symptoms, improve quality of life, and reduce the risk of conditions like dementia, osteoporosis, heart disease, and many cancers.

An avid supporter of the U.S. military, PA Mollet acknowledges that the PA profession was born from the ranks of the military and Navy veterans were among the first to work as PAs. She currently has a son serving as a cadet at West Point Military Academy.

PA Mollet remains connected to MBKU, lecturing on a variety of medical and surgical topics, and is an active member of the American Academy of PAs (AAPA), California Academy of PAs (CAPA), American Academy of Anti-Aging Medicine, and the Menopause Society.

In her spare time, PA Mollet enjoys attending her children's football games, rugby games, and other events, traveling with her husband, spending time with family and friends, volunteering at church, and singing.
