The program offers a rigorous 27-month post-baccalaureate course leading to the Master of Medical Science degree. Noteworthy is SPAS's dedication to an intimate learning environment, evident in its low 8:1 student-teacher ratio. Immersive community service activities foster camaraderie.

The class of 2023 exemplifies SPAS's success, with 83% securing early job offers and over 99% achieving NCCPA certification. Community engagement is integral, seen in joint student-faculty initiatives like health screenings and local outreach and its Master's Capstone Project integrates community values, addressing local healthcare needs through evidence-based interventions.

SPAS's infrastructure reflects excellence, maintaining contemporary facilities equipped with advanced healthcare technology. Exposure to underserved areas enriches students' perspectives, fostering compassion. The program holds Accreditation-Continued status from ARC-PA, underscoring its commitment to transformative education.







College of Pharmacy

In an era characterized by growing demand for patient care services, a surge in prescriptions filled annually, and the disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the significance of pharmacists and pharmaceutical medicines has become evident. MBKU responds by nurturing healthcare leaders with both expertise and empathy, dedicated to serving patients and communities.

At the heart of this vision is MBKU's College of Pharmacy—a close-knit institution designed for mentorship, offering the Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) degree. This degree reflects the college's commitment to cultivating skilled professionals who will shape the field of pharmaceuticals.

The program stands out for its tight-knit community and adaptability to advancements in pharmaceutical medicine. It equips students with a solid foundation and practical skills, facilitated by small class sizes and accessible faculty.

MBKU pharmacy students earn four certifications from the American Pharmacists Association (APhA), including areas like medication therapy management and immunization delivery. These certifications enhance student capabilities, preparing them for impactful contributions in their careers. The College of Pharmacy at MBKU fosters versatile, compassionate pharmacy professionals who redefine the pharmacist's role in healthcare and make positive community impacts.







Doctor of Medical Science (DMSc) program

Marshall B. Ketchum University's Doctor of Medical Science (DMSc) program prepares the next generation of PA educators, administrators and clinical leaders through a flexible, fully online and asynchronous curriculum. Created for both recent PA graduates and experienced clinicians, the program offers an innovative learning experience tailored to support advancement in academic and healthcare leadership roles.

MBKU's DMSc addresses a critical national need: although more than 178,000 PAs practice in the U.S., fewer than 2.4% hold doctoral-level training—despite rising demand for doctorally prepared PA faculty and administrators. Research shows that PAs with doctoral degrees experience increased promotions, higher salaries and expanded career opportunities, underscoring the value of advanced preparation.

The program provides two pathways. Recent graduates may enter the Advanced Professional Practice bridge program, completing an accelerated six-month curriculum focused on leadership and administration. Experienced PAs may pursue a 12-month concentration in either PA Education, designed to prepare future faculty and program directors, or Healthcare Administration and Leadership, built for those seeking greater organizational responsibility.

Grounded in universal design for learning, the DMSc program supports PAs at all stages of their careers. MBKU's goal is to develop effective educators, administrators and leaders who advance PA practice, strengthen healthcare delivery and elevate the profession through scholarship and innovation.


