



Other than the OAT, are there other standardized admissions tests accepted by SCCO?

What standardized test scores does SCCO accept other than the OAT?

While the OAT is the preferred standardized test, SCCO does accept the GRE, MCAT, DAT, or PCAT.

What are considered competitive scores for GRE, MCAT, DAT, or PCAT? Are there any minimum requirements?

There are no minimum requirements for either scores of GPA. Should you decide to apply with standardized test scores other than the OAT, competitive applicants are advised reach these standards:

GRE	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• BCP (biology, chemistry, physics) GPA of 3.0• Quantitative Reasoning: 154 (50th percentile)• Verbal Reasoning: 151 (50th percentile)
MCAT	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 480 - 500 range
DAT	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 17 - 19 range
PCAT	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 415 - 430 range

Do these scores ever expire?

Just like the OAT, these other standardized test scores do expire. The test must be taken within the two year period prior to the opening of the admissions cycle on July 1.

If I opt to take a test other than the OAT, will I be evaluated differently than someone who takes the OAT?

Applying with standardized test scores other than the OAT will not make you any less competitive.

How do I get my official scores submitted to SCCO for evaluation?

Follow OptomCAS instructions to submit your GRE scores as a part of your OptomCAS application. For the DAT, MCAT, and PCAT, log onto the respective testing sites and have your official scores submitted by using the service offered, either by sending them directly to SCCO via U.S. mail or email.
