SHUSHMA PATEL, PHARMD

Shushma Patel is an accomplished pharmacist and owner of The Prescription Shop, an independent pharmacy in Montebello that has been a model of community health partnership for over 65 years. She graduated with a Pharmacy degree from the Brighton School of Pharmacy in Sussex, England 1985 and was admitted to the Royal Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain the following year. During her pre-registration internships at the Royal Alexandra Children's Hospital in Brighton, Sussex, and John Radcliffe Hospital in Oxford, England, she developed a passion for community service and saw firsthand how her knowledge of medicine could impact patient lives across the full continuum of healthcare needs from the young to elderly.

Shushma has had a distinguished career in the corporate world, with over 30 years of experience in various retail settings, starting with Osco Drugs in California. She excelled in successive corporate mergers, including Sav-On, Albertson's, and more recently, CVS

Caremark. As a District Pharmacy Manager for a 65-store business portfolio, she won numerous recognition awards for delivering breakthrough achievements in managing both front-end and pharmacy operations. She has also served as a mentor and inspiration to countless women entering the healthcare profession.

In addition to her corporate career, Shushma has played many diverse leadership roles in industry associations and the local Montebello community. She currently serves on the Foundation Board of Trustees for the Beverly Hospital and has been an active Board Member of the Montebello Rotary Club since 2012, where she served as President for an annual term. Shushma is also a current Advisory Board Member of the Indian Pharmacist's Association, where she previously served successive terms as Chairman and Past President from 2008 to 2012.

Shushma's passion for community service extends beyond her professional endeavors. She is a certified Diabetic Educator and an enthusiastic proponent of spreading healthcare literacy, particularly amongst community members at risk of potential lifethreatening conditions such as Diabetes and Cardiovascular ailments. She regularly holds counseling sessions on this topic both at The Prescription Shop Pharmacy and at many surrounding residential care facilities in conjunction with local physicians and pharmaceutical companies.

Shushma was born in Tanzania and raised in London, England. She is one of four siblings and currently resides in Chino Hills with her two children; a daughter that shares her passion for public healthcare advocacy and a son who is an investment banker. She is licensed as a pharmacist with both the California State Board and the Nevada State Board of Pharmacy and completed her Master's in Business Administration in 2005.









The academic gowns that you see today represent a tradition that we inherited from the universities of the Middle Ages. Those institutions were founded by the church; and the students, being clerics, were obliged to wear their clerical gowns and caps at all times. Through the ages, these regalia were altered to accommodate both fashion and fancy.

In the United States, academic gowns are usually black, but the way they are worn and their cut distinguishes the wearer's academic degree. The bachelor's gown is worn closed; the master's and doctor's gown may be worn open or closed. Also, the sleeves of the gowns are shaped differently according to the level of degree: a bachelor's gown has long, pointed sleeves; a master's gown has oblong sleeves that are square in the back and have an arc cut away in the front; and a doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves. In addition, velvet panels and chevrons, either in black or the color representing the academic discipline, distinguish doctoral gowns.

The mortarboards or tams for all degree holders are black. The tassels attached to the mortarboards can be black, the color that the individual academic disciplines choose to represent their field, or in the case of faculty, gold. The hood is the most outstanding and colorful feature of the regalia. It is lined with the colors of the institution from which the wearers received their degrees.

Its size and shape indicate the wearer's degree; and its collar is the color of the academic discipline.

Student academic achievement at graduation with the Latin Honor System based on final grades at the end of the third professional year. Students who achieved Cum Laude status earned a grade point average of 3.40 to 3.59. They are wearing white honor cords. Students who earned Magna Cum Laude status had a grade point average of 3.60 to 3.79 and are wearing silver honor cords. Students who earned Summa Cum Laude status had a grade point average of 3.80 to 4.0 and wear gold honor cords.

Optometry is represented by the color sea foam green. The Physician Assistants wear kelly green. Pharmacy uses olive green. The colors are used for both the tassel and the velvet trim on the hood. The purple and gold satin lining of the hood represents the traditional colors of Marshall B. Ketchum University.

Along with the degree holder being identified by gown style and hood color, the holder is further identified by their place in the procession. Those having the highest faculty seniority are always positioned at the end of the processional.

UNIVERSITY MACE

Colleges and universities often employ a "mace" to connect the institution's customs with the best traditions of higher education dating to the first universities founded during the Middle Ages. A mace symbolizes authority, learning and scholarship, history, reputation and values. It suggests commemoration, elegance, honor, pageantry, purpose, quality, solemnity, stability and continuity.
