Kevin L. Alexander, OD, PhD

President Emeritus

Kevin L. Alexander, OD, PhD is President Emeritus of Marshall B. Ketchum University in Fullerton, California. He earned his O.D. and Ph.D. degrees at The Ohio State University. Following graduation, he was an OSU professor, teaching ocular disease and pharmacology, while he began his practice in Columbus, Ohio. Returning to Toledo, Ohio in the late eighties, he served as Center Director of The Eye Center of Toledo joining with ophthalmologists to pioneer optometric co-management of cataract patients. He later joined Retina Vitreous Associates advancing optometric co-management of retina patients. During his time in clinical practice, Dr. Alexander established a residency program in ocular disease and is credited with creating one of the first fellowships in vitreoretinal disease for optometrists.

In 2000, Dr. Alexander left clinical practice to become Dean of the Michigan College of Optometry at Ferris State University where he updated the curriculum, expanded residencies and fostered state-wide support for a new optometry building on the Ferris State campus. In 2008, he was selected President of Southern California College of Optometry and expanded its mission to include interdisciplinary health care education by creating Marshall B. Ketchum University (MBKU). Dr. Alexander was named the Founding President of MBKU in 2013, adding physician assistant studies and pharmacy to join the century-old optometry program. From 2013 to 2019 construction projects doubled the size of the MBKU campus.

Dr. Alexander has presented more than 275 lectures in 15 states, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and five countries. He has authored numerous articles and edited a textbook, "Primary Eyecare". He is a Fellow of the American Academy of Optometry and was a Diplomate of the American Board of Optometry from 2011 - 2020. Dr. Alexander has served as President of the Ohio Optometric Association, the Association of Schools and Colleges of Optometry and the American Optometric Association. He has received the Ohio State University Alumni Award for Distinguished Teaching and the H. Ward Ewalt Award for Distinguished Professional Service. Dr. Alexander has been an Ohio Optometrist of the Year and is a 2012 National Optometry Hall of Fame inductee. Upon his retirement, Marshall B Ketchum University renamed its Fullerton Campus in his honor.

After 14 years as President, Dr. Alexander retired from MBKU in July 2022, and will receive an honorary Doctor of Science degree from the university today.

Saysha Blazier, OD

Dr. Blazier received her Bachelor of Science in cell and molecular biology from Bradley University and her Doctor of Optometry degree in 2011 from Southern California College of Optometry. In 2011, she moved to Manhattan, where she completed a residency in low vision and ocular disease with the SUNY College of Optometry in partnership with Lighthouse International.

Dr. Blazier previously served as director of low vision services and clinical instructor at University Hospital associated with Rutgers University Medical School and has published posters and papers for research in vision and ophthalmology. She has spent the past seven years in private practice settings in Jersey City, New Jersey, and now Staten Island, New York. She is a fellow of the American Academy of Optometry and has served on both the New Jersey Society of Optometric Physicians (NJSOP) Board of Trustees and currently as president of the New York State Optometric Association (NYSOA).

She has served as president of the AOSA, chair of the New York State Optometric Association (NYSOA) Clinical Education and Meetings Committee and served on the AOA Leadership Development Committee. She was honored as Young Optometrist of the year in 2015, received the Presidential Special Recognition Award in 2018 and Distinguished Service Award in 2019 for the New Jersey Society of Optometric Physicians. Dr. Blazier was recognized as the Young Optometrist of the year by the New York State Optometric Association in 2021 and again nationally in 2022 by the American Optometric Association.

Thank you to the following organizations in the community for their support of our students.









The academic gowns that you see today represent a tradition that we inherited from the universities of the Middle Ages. Those institutions were founded by the church; and the students, being clerics, were obliged to wear their clerical gowns and caps at all times. Through the ages, these regalia were altered to accommodate both fashion and fancy.

In the United States, academic gowns are usually black, but the way they are worn and their cut distinguishes the wearer's academic degree. The bachelor's gown is worn closed; the master's and doctor's gown may be worn open or closed. Also, the sleeves of the gowns are shaped differently according to the level of degree: a bachelor's gown has long, pointed sleeves; a master's gown has oblong sleeves that are square in the back and have an arc cut away in the front; and a doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves. In addition, velvet panels and chevrons, either in black or the color representing the academic discipline, distinguish doctoral gowns.

The mortarboards or tams for all degree holders are black. The tassels attached to the mortarboards can be black, the color that the individual academic disciplines choose to represent their field, or in the case of faculty, gold. The hood is the most outstanding and colorful feature of the regalia. It is lined with the colors of the institution from which the wearers received their degrees.

Its size and shape indicate the wearer's degree; and its collar is the color of the academic discipline.

Student academic achievement at graduation with the Latin Honor System based on final grades at the end of the third professional year. Students who achieved Cum Laude status earned a grade point average of 3.40 to 3.59. They are wearing white honor cords. Students who earned Magna Cum Laude status had a grade point average of 3.60 to 3.79 and are wearing silver honor cords. Students who earned Summa Cum Laude status had a grade point average of 3.80 to 4.0 and wear gold honor cords.

Optometry is represented by the color sea foam green. The PAs wear kelly green. Pharmacy uses olive green. The colors are used for both the tassel and the velvet trim on the hood. The purple and gold satin lining of the hood represents the traditional colors of Marshall B. Ketchum University.

Along with the degree holder being identified by gown style and hood color, the holder is further identified by their place in the procession. Those having the highest faculty seniority are always positioned at the end of the processional.

UNIVERSITY MACE

Colleges and universities often employ a "mace" to connect the institution's customs with the best traditions of higher education dating to the first universities founded during the Middle Ages. A mace symbolizes authority, learning and scholarship, history, reputation and values. It suggests commemoration, elegance, honor, pageantry, purpose, quality, solemnity, stability and continuity.
