

A C A D E M I C R E G A L I A



The academic gowns that you see today represent a tradition that we inherited from the universities of the Middle Ages. Those institutions were founded by the church; and the students, being clerics, were obliged to wear their clerical gowns and caps at all times. Through the ages, these regalia were altered to accommodate both fashion and fancy.

In the United States, academic gowns are usually black, but the way they are worn and their cut distinguishes the wearer's academic degree. The bachelor's gown is worn closed; the master's and doctor's gown may be worn open or closed. Also, the sleeves of the gowns are shaped differently according to the level of degree: a bachelor's gown has long, pointed sleeves; a master's gown has oblong sleeves that are square in the back and have an arc cut away in the front; and a doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves. In addition, velvet panels and chevrons, either in black or the color representing the academic discipline, distinguish doctoral gowns.

The mortarboards or tams for all degree holders are black. The tassels attached to the mortarboards can be black, the color that the individual academic disciplines choose to represent their field, or in the case of faculty, gold. The hood is the most outstanding and colorful feature of the regalia. It is lined with the colors of the institution from which the wearers received their degrees. Its size and shape indicate the wearer's degree; and its collar is the color of the academic discipline.


Kelly green is the color used by Physician Assistant. Optometry wears seafoam green. Pharmacy uses khaki green. The colors are used for both the tassel and the velvet trim on the hood. The purple and gold satin lining of the hood represents the traditional colors of Marshall B. Ketchum University.

Along with the degree holder being identified by gown style and hood color, the holder is further identified by his place in the procession. Those having the highest faculty seniority are always positioned at the end of the processional.

UNIVERSITY MACE

Colleges and universities often employ a "mace" to connect the institution's customs with the best traditions of higher education dating to the first universities founded during the Middle Ages. A mace symbolizes authority, learning and scholarship, history, reputation and values. It suggests commemoration, elegance, honor, pageantry, purpose, quality, solemnity, stability and continuity.

RODERICK S. HOOKER, PHD, MBA, PA



Roderick S. Hooker is a health policy consultant interested in organizational efficiency and health workforce supply and demand. Rod spent two decades with Kaiser Permanente and then joined the faculty at the University of Texas with a joint appointment in the Department of Veterans Affairs in Dallas, Texas. After a decade of VA-focused health services research and developing a postgraduate program for PAs in rheumatology, he accepted the Senior Directorship with The Lewin Group in Washington, DC, a health policy consulting firm. At The Lewin Group, his work focused on modeling the supply and demand of health professionals; physicians, PAs, advanced practice nurses, and others. Concurrently Dr. Hooker was a consultant to the Ministry of Health in Ontario and New Brunswick to develop the PA profession in those provinces. A similar consultancy was developing

its PA corps in Queensland, Taiwan, Netherlands, and Scotland. His career includes being a US Navy corpsman during the Vietnam war, a tropical biologist, a Peace Corps volunteer, and a Coast Guard Reserve officer. He is a co-developer of the International Medical Workforce Collaborative, a joint program underwritten by four countries. The objective of the transnational group is to share new workforce research findings on medical service efficiency and outcomes of team-based care. Rod is a consultant to various health workforce research projects in different institutions and countries.

Dr. Hooker has written 3 books on PAs and authored 200 published papers, reports, book chapters, and articles on some aspects of health services research, focusing on the economics of physicians, PAs, and advanced practice RN utilization. He has been an adjunct faculty member of universities domestically and abroad. Retired, he lives in Ridgefield, Washington, and hikes in the Cascade Mountains.
